OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY ASSISTANT PROGRAM

THE PROGRAM:

Occupational Therapy Assistants (OTAs) use therapeutic interventions to facilitate recovery of clients and patients, so that they can return to functional and independent living. They use their skills to help them recover, improve and maintain their abilities in the areas of daily living skills, home management, school and work.

Occupational Therapy Assistants spend much of their time on their feet, setting up equipment and providing occupational therapy to their clients.

Our students will learn about the theories of practice and conceptual models within the field of occupational therapy which have guided occupational therapy practitioners in a variety of practice settings. They will also learn basic clinical skills, problem solving and critical thinking skills essential to client-centered occupational therapy practice.

ADMISSION TO THE PROGRAM:

Applications to the OTA Program must be **fully completed** and **submitted by the September 1st** deadline each year to be considered for the student cohort beginning in the following spring semester of the new year.

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS:

1. Completion of all general admission requirements to become a student at the college including the Washington State College of Ohio Application for Admission.
 2. Submission of the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program Application
 3. American College Test (ACT) composite score of 18 or higher or the equivalent composite SAT score OR an associate's degree or higher.
 4. A minimum of a 2.5 cumulative grade point average (GPA) for recent course work from an educational institution. Your GPA will be based on any college coursework taken within the last 2 calendar years or your cumulative high school GPA, whichever is more recent.
 5. A minimum of 20 hours of documented observation experience with an occupational therapist or occupational therapy assistant.
- **Please see the official OTA Application Packet for specific details related to Entrance Requirements.**
 - Prerequisite classes must be completed prior to admission into the technical phase of the program.
 - To be eligible for graduation, a student **must complete all** courses listed with a "C" or better **and** maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 2.0. **You cannot be accepted with a GPA lower than 2.5.**
